Lexington Senior High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school, 2019-2020 enrollments of 808 students in grades 9-12. The student body demographic makeup is 31% African-American, 20% Caucasian, 38% Hispanic and 11% Other.

Curriculum

With a hybrid--concentrated block and A/B day--schedule at Lexington Senior High School, students have the opportunity to complete eight (8) credits each school year. Twenty-eight (28) units of credit are required for graduation. AP® courses are offered in AP Seminar, AP Research, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Calculus, Environmental Science, World History, U.S. History, Human Geography, US Government & Politics, Psychology and Studio Art. AP is an open-enrollment program.

Honors classes are offered in English I, English II, English III, English IV, Math I, Math II, Math III, Discrete Math, Pre-Calculus, Biology, Chemistry, Earth/Environmental Science, Anatomy & Physiology, Civics & Economics, World History, American History I, American History II, Psychology, Spanish III, Spanish IV, JROTC III, JROTC IV, Art III, Art IV, Band III, Band IV, Choral Ensemble III, Choral Ensemble IV, Physical Education, Health and Physical Education, Digital Design & Animation II, Electronics II, CTE Advanced Studies, Marketing, and Entrepreneurship.

The High School to Community College Articulation Agreement with Davidson County Community College allows students to receive community college credit for courses taken while in high school. The Career & College Promise Program enables eligible juniors and seniors to enroll in college transfer courses to earn college credit as well as high school credits, and have the opportunity to experience the college-learning environment.

Special Curriculum

AP (Advanced Placement) Capstone and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) are course options at Lexington Senior High School.

GPA/Class Rank

Lexington Senior High School uses an evaluation code based on a 4.0 Grade Point Average (GPA). Honors courses are weighted .5 quality point and Advanced Placement (AP) courses and community college courses are weighted one quality point. Class rank is cumulative and utilizes the weighted Grade Point Average. Class ranks are calculated at the end of each semester. The following scale outlines this evaluation code.
